# Bedroom + Closet Declutter Checklist

Start with visible clutter first, then move into drawers, shelves, and closet spaces. Keep only what you actually use, love, or need.

## Bedroom Checklist

- Clear items from nightstands
- Remove old cups, wrappers, receipts, and random paper
- Put away clean clothes
- Add dirty clothes to the laundry basket
- Sort items sitting on the bed or floor
- Remove decor pieces that make the room feel crowded
- Declutter under the bed
- Sort books, notebooks, and magazines
- Clear dresser tops
- Choose one small basket for daily-use items

## Closet Checklist

- Remove clothes you no longer wear
- Set aside clothes that do not fit comfortably
- Donate items you have not worn in a long time
- Remove damaged clothes you will not repair
- Group similar items together
- Keep everyday outfits easy to reach
- Fold or hang seasonal clothes neatly
- Declutter shoes you never wear
- Remove empty boxes and shopping bags
- Create one simple spot for accessories

**Quick Tip:** If the room feels overwhelming, choose only one drawer, one shelf, or one corner today. Small progress still counts.

# Kitchen + Bathroom Declutter Checklist

These rooms collect small items quickly. Focus on expired products, duplicates, unused tools, and anything that makes daily routines harder.

## Kitchen Checklist

- Throw away expired food
- Check spices and baking supplies
- Remove duplicate utensils
- Declutter plastic containers without lids
- Sort mugs, cups, and water bottles
- Clear the kitchen counter
- Remove appliances you rarely use
- Organize pantry items by type
- Toss old takeout menus, papers, and bags
- Create one easy spot for daily cooking items

## Bathroom Checklist

- Throw away expired skincare and beauty products
- Remove empty bottles
- Declutter old towels or washcloths
- Sort hair tools and accessories
- Toss products you tried but never use
- Clear the bathroom counter
- Store medicine and first-aid items safely
- Remove duplicate cleaning products
- Sort under-sink storage
- Keep daily-use products in one easy basket

**Quick Tip:** Counters make a room feel messy fast. Clear the counter first, then organize cabinets and drawers later.

# Living Room + Whole-Home Reset Checklist

## Living Room Checklist

- Remove cups, plates, and snack wrappers
- Fold blankets and straighten pillows
- Clear the coffee table
- Sort remote controls, chargers, and cables
- Remove old magazines, papers, and mail
- Put misplaced items back in their rooms
- Declutter decor that makes shelves look crowded
- Organize books, games, and entertainment items
- Create one basket for daily living room items
- Do a quick floor reset

## Whole-Home Quick Reset

- Collect trash from every room
- Collect dirty laundry
- Put dishes in the kitchen
- Return misplaced items to the correct rooms
- Choose one donation bag or box
- Wipe one high-use surface
- Clear one clutter pile
- Refresh one small area that bothers you most
